## What You Can Do With a Major In... **Anthropology**

A major in Anthropology prepares a student to work in business, research, teaching, and social services. An anthropologist studies the development and origin of mankind. Anthropologists ask the questions: What does it mean to be human? Why does a group behave in a particular way? What events in history have shaped the behavior of a group of people? What environmental factors have influenced why people act the way they do? An anthropologist is interested in exploring the biological and the cultural bases of human behavior. They study how people move around the earth, how people in different parts of the world are different and how they are alike. The field is broad and is divided into sub-fields: archaeology, cultural anthropology, physical anthropology, and anthropological linguistics.
