

Early Admission Checklist

To be accepted as an early admission student you must:

1. have completed the equivalent of your junior year in high school (a minimum of six semesters) and require only one more year to complete all the requirements for a high school diploma
2. have proof of a SAT score of at least 1200 with a Verbal component score of no less than 440 and a Quantitative component score of no less than 440; if you will be submitting ACT test scores, you must have a 27 EACT with no less than 17 on the English component, 18 on the Reading component, and 19 on the Math component
3. have earned a 3.5 high school grade point average (as computed by the USFSP Office of Admissions and Records)
4. meet all the admission requirements for a regular degree-seeking student

In addition to official high school transcripts and SAT or ACT testing results, you must also submit the following documents:

1. A completed SUS application for admissions with a \$30.00 non-refundable application fee
2. A personal letter outlining your reasons for pursuing an early admission opportunity at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg
3. A signed statement of approval from your high school principal or guidance counselor (see the link below to download and print this form)
4. A completed "Supplemental Information for Early Admission" form (see the link below to download and print this form)
5. If you are a home schooled student, you must submit an official copy of your letter of intent with your home school district
6. A list of the credits that you need to graduate from your high school

Course Information—Early Admission

1. Students enrolled in an early admission program must take courses that are creditable toward the high school diploma and the associate or baccalaureate degree
2. Any course that contains the common course designation and numbering system is eligible for inclusion in the dual enrollment program. However, students and counselors should evaluate the students' educational plans when using specialty courses for dual enrollment. To ensure transferability of credits, students and college advisors may wish to concentrate on general education courses for students seeking associate in arts or baccalaureate degrees
3. College preparatory instruction, other forms of pre-collegiate instruction, and physical education courses that focus on the execution of a skill rather than the intellectual attributes of the activity are not eligible for inclusion in the dual enrollment program. In some cases, vocational preparatory instruction can be considered for inclusion in the dual enrollment program.

Items required to complete the early admission application:

1. **Statement of Legal Compliance** (to be completed by nonpublic high schools or home school parent)
2. **USFSP Application for Admission**—Completed and signed by the student. To establish proof of Florida Residence, you must submit documentation concerning the parent or guardian's residency; this documentation includes: tax returns, letter of domicile, voter's registration card, Florida driver's license, and etc. Non-US Citizens must submit a photocopy of their Resident Alien cards (both sides).
3. **Proof of Measles Immunization and USF Health Form**—This is required of all students attending USF classes for the first time; this requirement includes proof of two measles vaccinations (at least 30 days apart) and one rubella vaccination or 2 MMR's (at least 30 days apart).
4. **USFSP Supplemental Information for Early Admission Form**

The early admission does not include the cost of parking decals, textbooks, library fines, parking fines, and student ID's. The student will be held responsible for these costs.
